

Q & A WITH Warren Thomas

Executive Golf Professional, Cobble Beach Golf Links

Q: When and how did you get started in golf and was there a particular person who helped with your introduction to the game?

A: When I was around 11 years old, my mom and dad would take me to play, which started my interest. They would take me to the course with them to play nine holes, and from there, I was hooked on the game. A few years later, I would bike 5 miles to hitch a ride to the course with an employee that worked there. I would golf all day while he worked.

Q: I understand that you set the course record at Sauble Golf and Country Club. Can you tell me when that was, what you shot and any other details you can remember from that day?

A: When I was about 18 years old, I worked 6 days a week and played 36 holes every Tuesday. In my first round that day, I shot 69 and figured that would be the best score. I was way off! I birdied 9 of the first 11 holes at Sauble and proceeded to post 64. I have never beaten that score, but my next best round was 3 years ago at Cobble Beach when I had a 66 with no bogeys.

Q: At what point did you decide to become a golf professional and what steps did you take to make that happen?

A: I received a partial scholarship to Sam Houston College in Texas but ended up attending Laurentian University in Sudbury for my Economics degree. I was going to be a stockbroker, and for some reason, I chose not to pursue that career. I got on as an Assistant Golf Professional with Master Professional Tony Evershed, and that was the beginning of my club

pro career.

Q: Where did you play as a youngster and did you compete in junior events?

I competed on the Grey Bruce Junior Tour and a few other tours in southern Ontario. The biggest event I played in was an AJGA (American Junior Golf Association) event at Bethpage Black in New York in 1989. It was a fantastic experience, but it is the most challenging course I have ever played at to this day. Q: What was your first job in the golf industry and where else have you worked as a golf professional?

A: I worked with Tony Evershed at the Idylwylde (a private club) in Sudbury from 1992 to 2000. From there, I headed to York Downs for the 2001 golf season. Ian Crebbin was the Head Golf Professional there, and I learned so much from him. Ian is currently running the Oakdale Golf Club, where the Canadian Open takes place this year. **Continued next page**

A: I worked at York Downs for 3 seasons and then took my first Head Professional job at the 36-hole Horseshoe Resort Facility. Unfortunately, Horseshoe had some financial issues, and I was only there for one full season. I decided to teach primarily juniors the following summer, which was quite rewarding. The next season in 2006, I took an associate job at Thornhill and worked with Tim Moore. Again, I learned a lot from him, which set me up to get the job at Cobble Beach in 2007. Interestingly to note, when I applied at Cobble Beach, the person hiring was Mike Doyle, and his best friend was a member at Yorkdowns. His accountant was also a member at Thornhill Golf Club, and I had taught both of these gentlemen, which certainly helped me get my job here at Cobble Beach!

Q: You've been in a good position to watch the progression of Cobble Beach from the beginning until now. How would you describe what you've witnessed over the years and how gratifying is it to be part of it?

A: We opened in 2007, right before the 2008 economic crisis; the market for golfing was terrible. For the first 6 to 8 years, it was tough. The course struggled to get enough golfers, and the home sales were slow. However, the company was persistent, and word-of-mouth began to spread about the gem of a golf course on Georgian Bay. The owners have continued to push Cobble Beach and the region through major events, such as the Cobble Beach Concours d'Elegance and the International Auto-Show. These events have helped cement the Cobble Beach name and increase awareness of our beautiful golf community. Now people know Cobble Beach. The community is growing, with over 200 units on-site. We have consistently ranked a top 100 Canadian golf course and have received significant recognition through partnerships like TSN and Golf Talk Canada.

Q: Your job has changed in recent years to Executive Golf Professional. Can you describe how your job is different now and what aspects you focus on more now in that position?

members with the experience they deserve and expect from us. BJ Oliver is our Head Golf Professional and helps me so much day-today. His primary focus is retail, which is a full-time job in itself. He also helps in the day-to-day operations, allowing me to focus on a few other key things. One is sales, which has been a key focus as we always need to be selling. This winter, selling was one of my major tasks, and I succeeded as we are very busy with Play and Stay quests early this season. Another focus is increasing membership and working with the new homeowners to get them signed up as golf members at Cobble Beach. The onboarding process of a new golf member is so important to make their experience great.

Q: I'm sure it's hard to pick a favourite, but is there a particular golf experience you've had that is most memorable to you? (If you can't pick just one maybe the top 3)?

A: I remember when I was 15 years old, and I was golfing in South Carolina near Hilton Head. It was the last day of our trip, and I was hitting range balls while waiting for my ride. A fellow on the range said I had an excellent swing and wondered if I played competitively. I said, 'yes, and I was here with my family on a golf trip'. He said I had a great swing and to keep at it. Well, about 3 weeks later, I was watching the Masters on TV and guess what? It was Fred Couples that spoke to me on the range. It was fantastic to see! This happened before Freddie was famous and before he ended up winning the Masers. Still a cool experience!

Q: Outside of golf, what are your interests and hobbies?

A: There is not much time outside of work, but when there is, you can find me at the hockey rink. I have coached hockey for roughly 9 years and have thoroughly enjoyed helping to develop these young players. Currently, I am coaching an AA Maitland Ice Shark Spring team. I also enjoy fishing, hunting and travelling.

Q: What's your dream golf foursome?

A: Cobble Beach has grown to a point where we needed to expand our team to provide guests and A: This is a tough one...however, Jack Nicklaus, my dad and mom would be the dream foursome.


New bridge among improvements at Legacy Ridge

Course improvements during the offseason at Legacy Ridge Golf Club include a new bridge on the 7th hole. The new structure should improve pace of play as it takes walking golfers on a significant shortcut through the woods to the fairway.

The bridge is not designed for power carts and they will still have to be driven around the path that loops around to the west before heading back toward the fairway.

The club has also added interlocking stones to a section of the gravel cart path just to the south of the 5th tee. This is to prevent against the path being washed out during heavy rainfalls.

Some tree management was done throughout the late fall and late winter and further course improvements planned for this season include forward tee restorations and turf stoning the path through the gully on #5 to the short range.


