
Florida bound

Doug Gilmour

NHL Hall of Famer talked about his love of golf while visiting Saugeen Golf **Club for the Crime Stoppers of Grey Bruce fundraising tournament**

Q: How often do you play golf?

A: I belong to Burlington Golf and Country Club and I try to play once or twice a week. Some months are a little different. Tournaments, thank God, are back on and it's so nice to get back out in the public and see everybody. I think I've played more tournament rounds than regular rounds this year.

Q: Do you track your handicap?

A: Yes, my handicap has gone up recently to 16. I can't really put in my scores because when I start playing better everybody starts calling me a sandbagger. I told the pro I'm going to lie about my scores.

Q: What keeps you busy besides golf these days?

A: I'm 59 now and I kind of pick and choose where I go and what I do. I have a marketing team called Team 93 that some guys run for me and we've got a golf tournament coming up at Thundering Waters in Niagara. It's actually the Bobby Orr tournament that used to be in Parry Sound. I put my name on it to be a part of it. I also work as an ambassador for the (Toronto Maple) Leafs.

Q: What skills do you see as transferrable from hockey to golf?

A: The hand-eye coordination, obviously, but also the concentration side of it. Once you don't play as much as you used to you have to lower your expectations. My short game used to be great but it's now average. I don't practice and I've never taken a lesson in my life. I watch a lot of videos and my wife told me to stop watching them because they are screwing me up.

Q: Do you still play any hockey now?

A: No. I was playing before COVID but my body just can't take it. I play the charity games for Easter Seals but that's about it. I'm 59 and I don't want to get hurt.

Q: Final thoughts on golf and what it means to you?

A: It's a fun game and I hope I can play it for a long time.


Junior Invitational rained out


"I was very proud to run this event which we will do again going forward," he said.








The other division winner was Janelle Fairgrieve (The Links at Dover Coast) Stroke Play Gross – 70 and Above.


